### Template Instructions

The one-page profile assignment will assist in introducing you to your placement community. Students report that including a brief description of their strengths, goals and a description of how they like to be supported helps foster positive experiences and relationships within their placement workplaces.

Your finished one-page profile document will be shared with your placement host community (school, clinic, etc). You will find a template and exemplar in the following pages. When using the template, retain the document header, including university logo and program information. Be sure to include your name and course code. If you prefer to use a graphics program like Canva or similar, include all of the elements shown in the template to ensure consistency.

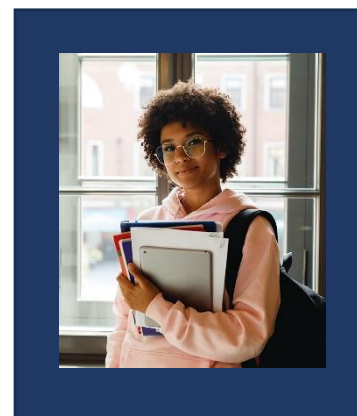
At the time your one-page profile is due, students may not yet be connected with their placement host or placement community/colleagues. This is okay, as the document should represent you in any setting or employment sector.

Choose a headshot that features you as professional. Photos that include other individuals, social settings or photos that contain personal information should not be used. Students may opt to exclude a photo from their one-page profile if they choose.

Finally, remember that this assignment is called a One-Page Placement Profile for a reason! The document should only be one page in length. Variation from the template is fine, however the document should retain an overall professional feel. Avoid adding more than one page, as this document should be easily distinguished from a resume. **One-Page assignments should be saved as a PDF and saved as SurnameFirstnameProfile.pdf (BuellJenniferProfile.pdf).** **You can upload your one-page profile using the clearance web form.**

You will find a template, exemplar and rubric at the end of this assignment package. Please only submit your one-page profile. Do not include the instructions or exemplar in your assignment when submitted.

### ▼ How to Best Support Me:

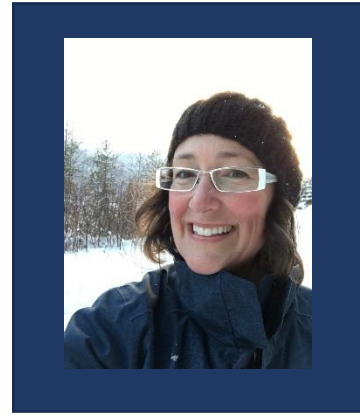

Do you like to work collaboratively or independently? Be as honest as you can, as this tool can help others help you be more comfortable in your new workplace.
